H-SPACE 2017

“Integrated space systems, missions and concepts”

February 9-10, 2017, Budapest, Hungary

The Federated Innovation and Knowledge Centre (EIT), within the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Informatics at the Budapest University of Technology and Economics (BME) – in cooperation with the Hungarian Astronautical Society - organizes an international conference on space research under the name of H-SPACE 2016. Following the success of H-SPACE 2015 and H-SPACE 2016, this becomes the 3rd International Conference on Research, Technology and Education of Space.

The topic of this year’s conference is “Integrated space systems, missions and concepts”. The agenda of the conference addresses scientific, technological and educational aspects of space research and space activities. The conference is open to both international and local professionals. It also provides an opportunity to showcase Hungarian scientific, technological, educational and outreach activities, related to space. The conference consists of three main sections, related to Science and Technology (in English), followed by Education and Outreach (in Hungarian only).

We accept abstracts for oral and poster presentations. All accepted papers will be published electronically. The authors of the best lectures will be given an option to publish their papers in peer-reviewed journals. Thus, their contribution to the conference will both highlight their scientific progress and provide an additional publication opportunity.

Sessions are proposed and scheduled on the day they’re given, which means the usual “hallway conversations” turn into full-fledged topics. The SpaceUp Budapest 2017 is organized by the Space Generation Advisory Council (SGAC), the Budapest University of Technology and Economics (BME), the Hungarian Astronautical Society (MANT), and the Scientific Association for Infocommunications (HTE).
